



New Orleans, LA (NOLA) – Service Immersion Trips

General Information for NLYM/NCL

This information is provided as a guide and is based on previous Shirts Across America immersion trips. Please note this is subject to change for each trip.

Dates: **Saturday, June 20 - Saturday, June 27, 2020- Summer Break Trip**

Building in NOLA: **Shirts Across America (SAA)** has one volunteer trip to New Orleans available for the NLYM/NCL group: Summer Break. SAA is focused on building homes and building leaders as we work with SBP, Youth Rebuilding New Orleans and Habitat for Humanity to build homes in the New Orleans area. Since 2008, SAA has sent approximately 3,400 volunteers to work on 190+ homes/projects in the Gulf Coast.

SAA partners with three rebuilding organizations to ensure that our resources are being deployed in a way that will directly impact families trying to move home. SBP (formerly St. Bernard Project), YRNO (Youth Rebuilding New Orleans) and NOAHH (New Orleans Area Habitat for Humanity) are dedicated to educating volunteers and transforming homeowners' lives.

SAA volunteers will work in several unique neighborhoods in the greater New Orleans region. Each team (see below) will work for approximately 6-8 hours per day. Building tasks will vary based upon location. Teams attend orientation with SBP, YRNO or NOAHH on the morning of the first workday, where they receive job assignments for the week as well as an in-depth safety training.

Trip Teams: After being invited to attend the 2020 Summer Break trip, each student will be placed on a team. These teams of 5 to 7 people travel together throughout the entire trip. Each team has at least one Adult Team Lead who mentors their team and drives the team's van while in New Orleans. All Adult Team Leads meet the students selected to be on their team prior to traveling with the group. The students understand that their Adult Team Leads are "Coaches" and they are to treat them as such.

Teams are created with students from the same organization. While several high schools may be a part of the larger traveling group, students will be working side-by-side with peers they attend school with.

In order to help volunteers learn about New Orleans and its unique and diverse culture, SAA provides different events and entertainment for times when teams are not on their job sites.

Accommodations: St. Jude Community Center, Camp Restore, or a similar facility.

SAA has longstanding partnerships with St. Jude Community Center and Camp Restore. Both facilities are dedicated to serving the local communities in which they are located. St. Jude's is located on Rampart Street within walking distance of the French Quarter. Each day, St. Jude's provides meals for people experiencing homelessness and distributes food to area food banks. Camp Restore, located in New Orleans East, directly provides assistance to those recovering from the tornado that hit the neighborhood in February of 2017.

Food: Most meals are provided by our housing partners and are included in the cost of the trip. On occasion, SAA partners with local restaurants that provide meals to our student and parent volunteers. Some of the meals are paid for by SAA, while a few meals are part of each volunteer's out-of-pocket expenses.

Cost: The cost for the 2020 Shirts Across America immersion trip is **\$1,525** per volunteer. This covers airfare, ground transportation, building partner fees, housing, most meals, museum visits, a musical experience, and other cultural activities.

Time Commitment: SAA creates dynamic service immersion trips that work to educate and inspire all volunteers to be leaders. In order to prepare all student volunteers for the trips and to ensure each parent/guardian is informed about SAA's program, there will be two mandatory student and parent/guardian meetings. The first meeting, held in March, is an educational meeting to give students and parents additional context for serving in New Orleans. The second meeting, held closer to the date of the trip, gives students and parents logistical information. A full calendar of each school's meetings will be emailed out separately.
